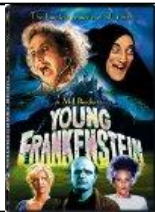


June 14 – “Up!” – *Family Night*

Another classic by PIXAR. By tying thousands of balloons to his home, 78-year-old Carl Fredrickson sets out to fulfill his lifelong dream. After lifting off, however, he learns he isn't alone on his journey. Russell, a wilderness explorer 70 years his junior, has inadvertently become a stowaway on the trip. “Easily the summer's, and probably the year's, most enchanting movie, *Up* is a buoyant delight.” - *Claudia Puig, USA TODAY*

June 21 – “Young Frankenstein” – *Comedy Night*

Gene Wilder is Dr. Frankenstein's grandson, who after years of living down the family reputation, inherits granddad's castle and repeats the experiments. “Director [Mel Brooks](#) is home with *Young Frankenstein*, his most disciplined and visually inventive film (it also happens to be very funny).” – *Roger Ebert, Chicago Sun-Times*



June 28 – “O Brother, Where Art Thou?”

George Clooney stars in Ethan & Joel Coen's take on Homer's epic poem "The Odyssey", set in the deep south during the 1930's. Three escaped convicts search for hidden treasure while a relentless lawman pursues them. Features a Bluegrass soundtrack and was nominated for Two Academy Awards.



July 12 – “The Dark Knight” – *From Comic Book to Screen*

Heath Ledger won a posthumous Best Actor Oscar for his creepy turn as the Joker who menaces Gotham City in the second installment of director Christopher Nolan's remake of the Batman series. “The haunting and visionary *Dark Knight* soars on the wings of untamed imagination. It's full of surprises you don't see coming.” - *Peter Travers, Rolling Stone*



July 19 – “Man On Wire” – *Documentary Night*

In the matter of one morning in 1974, Philippe Petit went from being an unknown acrobat to a worldwide celebrity. *Man on Wire* takes a look at tightrope walker Petit's daring, but illegal, high-wire routine performed between New York City's World Trade Center's twin towers, what some consider, "the artistic crime of the century."
